# Biosecurity alert Hendra virus – information for industry 1 August 2011

# Hendra virus - 2011 summary

The number of locations in Queensland with confirmed cases of Hendra virus this year is eight.

Quarantines have been revoked today on two properties in the Beaudesert area following completion of three rounds of negative testing.

Horses are being monitored daily on the remaining eleven quarantined properties by Biosecurity Queensland staff in conjunction with the horse owners. All horses appear to be clinically normal.

The number of confirmed horse deaths from Hendra virus in Queensland this year since June 2011 is ten.
