Hendra virus – 2011 summary

The number of locations in Queensland with confirmed cases of Hendra virus this year is eight.

The number of confirmed horse deaths from Hendra virus in Queensland this year is ten.

A third quarantine has been revoked today on a property in the Beaudesert area following completion of the required three rounds of negative testing.

Horses are being monitored daily on the remaining quarantined properties by Biosecurity Queensland staff in conjunction with the horse owners. All horses are reported as clinically normal.
