Biosecurity alert **Hendra virus – information for industry**23 August 2011

Hendra virus – Gold Coast Hinterland

Biosecurity Queensland today confirmed a Hendra virus case on a property in the Gold Coast hinterland.

The infected horse had shown a rapid onset of illness and died today. A private veterinarian visited the horse yesterday and collected samples for Hendra virus testing.

Biosecurity Queensland has quarantined the property and is working with the horse and property owners in conjunction with other government agencies.

Hendra virus - 2011 summary

The number of locations in Queensland with confirmed cases of Hendra virus this year is nine.

The number of confirmed horse deaths from Hendra virus in Queensland this year is eleven.

The properties in Hervey Bay and Boondall have been released from quarantine.

There are currently five properties in Queensland under quarantine in the Kuranda, Chinchilla and Gold Coast hinterland areas.

Horses are being monitored daily on quarantined properties by Biosecurity Queensland staff in conjunction with the horse owners.

Community Engagement

Biosecurity Queensland and Queensland Health staff will be doorknocking neighbours of the quarantined property in the Gold Coast hinterland area to gather information on their animals and provide information about Hendra virus.

A Hendra virus information session will be held at the Gayndah Town Hall on Thursday 25 August at 6:30pm.
